# RECYCLING

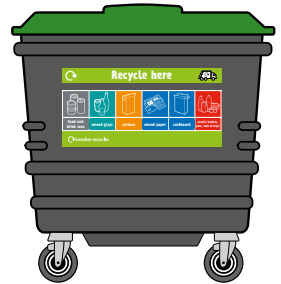
Use for **GLASS, PLASTIC, PAPER** and **CARD, CANS, FOIL, CARTONS** and **AEROSOLS**.

**Empty** and **rinse** all containers before putting them into the bin.

**Remove film lids** from plastic pots, tubs and trays and put them in the rubbish.

**Do not use black sacks.** However, you can keep your recycling in a plastic carrier bag and put the whole bag into the recycling bin.

**Right thing, right bin!** Wrong items placed in recycling bins can prevent collections. Your landlord/managing agent/housing provider will be charged for clearance.

# FOOD RECYCLING

Use for **ALL FOOD WASTE** including **PEELINGS, EGG SHELLS, BONES** and **PLATE SCRAPINGS**

Islington Council recycles food waste to turn it into **electricity** or **compost**. We provide kitchen caddies and compostable liners for free.

**Line your kitchen caddy with a compostable liner** and put your food waste in it.

When you need to empty your caddy, **tie the top of the liner** and put it in the outside food bin.

You can donate unwanted but reusable household and electrical goods to be collected by our partner organisations from your address. This is a free service. Visit **[www.islington.gov.uk/bulkywaste](http://www.islington.gov.uk/bulkywaste)** to find out more.

Use your lumber point (free) to get rid of large items (ask your caretaker or housing office for details).
